VISION: A diverse learning community composed of knowledgeable and caring professionals committed to empowering individuals so they may be knowledgeable, creative and ethical as they contribute to the dynamic global society.

MISSION: Our mission is facilitating the development of individuals and delivering programs and services to meet the needs of the professional communities served by the college.

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GOALS:

- Involve students in transformative learning experiences related to discipline knowledge, research, creative, scholarly activities, leadership, service learning, civic engagement, global and cultural competencies, and health and wellness.
- Develop partnerships, collaborations and other opportunities to meet identified and unmet community needs.
- Enhance programs that serve identified needs in the Metropolitan Oklahoma City communities.
- Develop delivery models that maximize access to various student populations.

STUDENTS:

Student Enrollment for Fall 2016: 4,531 declared majors (3,558 undergraduate / 973 graduate); 74% female / 26% male; average age is 27; 40% minority students including 71 international students / 94% in-state residents.

FACULTY:

Faculty for Fall 2017: 100 full-time faculty (89% hold doctoral degrees); education faculty average over 15 years of public school teaching experience; 83% of graduate courses and 62% of undergraduate courses are taught by full-time faculty.

EDUCATOR PREPARATION:

Oklahoma's original teacher preparation program has been accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) since 1954. It is one of the largest programs in Oklahoma having prepared more than 50,000 teachers. There are 27 initial and advanced programs in 25 certification areas. Its Urban Teacher Preparation Academy (UTPA) prepares teachers for urban schools, particularly in Oklahoma City Public Schools (OKCPS).

Art, Dance, Early Childhood (initial and advanced), Educational Leadership (advanced), Elementary Education (initial and advanced), Elementary Math Specialist (advanced), English, English as a Second Language (advanced), Gifted Education Specialist (advanced), History, Modern Languages, Library Media Specialist (advanced), Mathematics, Instrumental and Vocal Music, Physical Education, Reading Specialist (advanced), School Counselor (advanced), School Psychology (advanced), Science, Special Education-Mild/Moderate and Severe/Profound, Speech-Language Pathology and Theater. Additionally, there is an alternative certification support route in Secondary and Special Education (advanced).

PROFESSIONAL STUDIES PROGRAMS:

Nutrition, Dietetics and Food Management, Kinesiology, Psychology, Industrial Safety, Family Life Education, Fashion Marketing, Adult and Higher Education, Organizational Leadership, Wellness Management, Athletic Training, Community Public Health and others.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCES:

Many area schools, agencies and partnership organizations collaborate to provide clinical experiences for students in various programs within the college.
